## Year 12-13 Geography Bridging Work 2020

- 2. Complete the 'Thinking Synoptically' activities from page 66-67 of the Pearson Book 1 again this page can be found on Sharepoint or via your live log-in to the Pearson book.
- Organise your Tectonic folder I will want to see it, along with the work above on our first lesson back
   – probably Friday 11<sup>th</sup> of September
  - Challenge: If you are feeling particularly inspired you can look at the reading and resource list on Sharepoint and choose one of the books to read or one of the documentaries to watch. Team Geography will be updating this as we watch/read and learn of good resources...

It is imperative that all of this work is completed by our first lessons back in September, do not leave it all to the last week of the holidays – you have the week of the 13<sup>th</sup> of July when there are no scheduled live lessons to make a start on this.
