



Message from the Deputy Headteacher

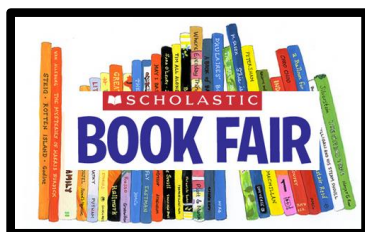

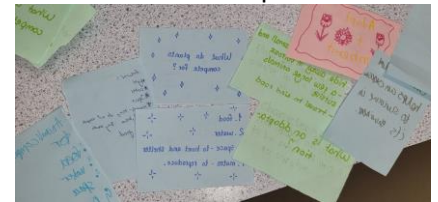
A term full of opportunities!

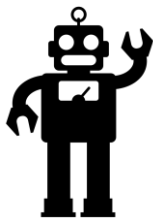
