### Year 12 Psychology- London Zoo

Our year 12 psychology students went to London Zoo to complete a scientific observation of their chosen animal, which ranged from tiny monkeys to giant giraffes, penguins, and endangered species like the okapi.

Students also had the opportunity to look around the zoo at other animals such as the Asiatic lions and the tigers and learn about how the zoo contributes to the conservation of animals all around the world. This includes scientific research into animal behaviour, as well as diseases that are affecting particular species such as tree frogs in the wild. The purpose of this trip was to get a first-hand experience of planning, conducting, and evaluating psychological research.

Students then collated their results and will present them to their classes next week which we are all looking forward to.

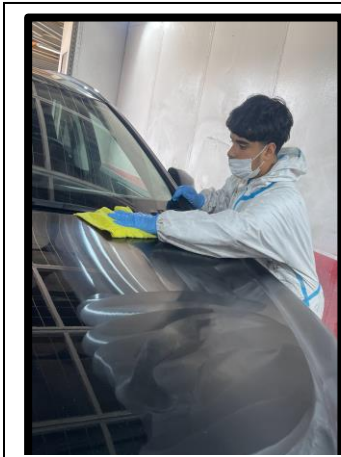

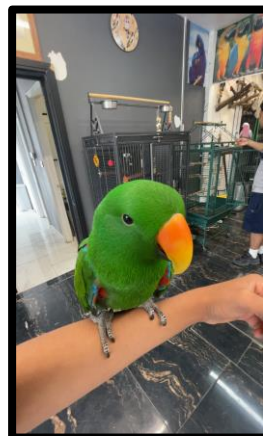

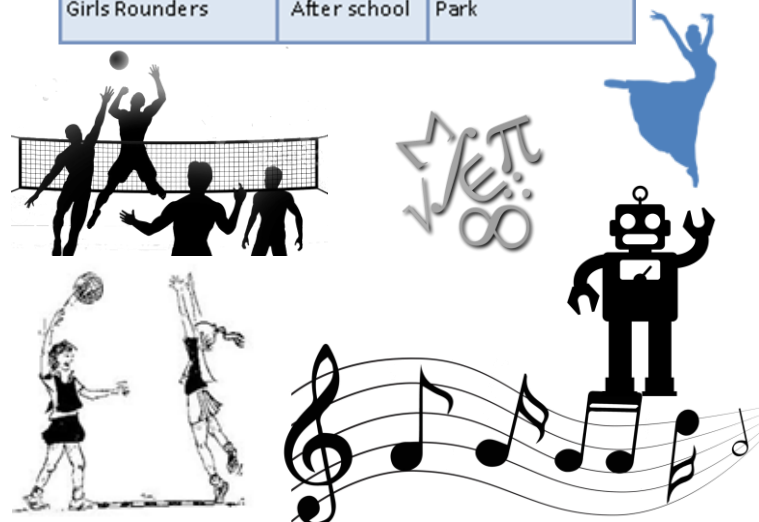
