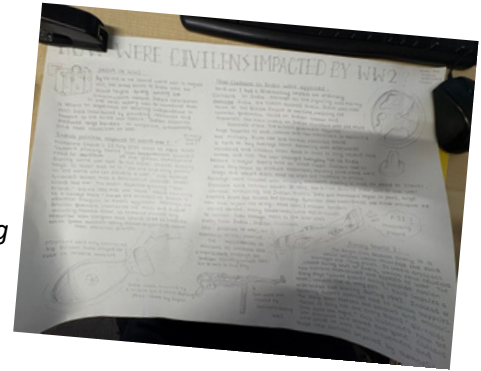


Year 9
