Y7 Netball Crowned Harrow Borough Champions

The Year 7 Netball team delivered an outstanding performance at the Harrow Borough Tournament, showcasing skill, determination, and impressive teamwork throughout the competition.

U15 Football Team Reach Borough Final Again

The U15s have booked their place in the borough final for the second consecutive season after a dramatic semifinal win over Salvatorian before the Easter break. The team burst into an early 3–0 lead thanks to a superb solo goal from Denis, a composed finish from Adam, and a thunderous top-corner strike from Hothaifa following an excellent driving run.

Salvo pulled one back just before halftime, shifting the momentum and setting up a tense second half. At 3–3, Adam almost sealed the win in normal time after weaving through the defence and curling a brilliant effort towards the far corner, only for the goalkeeper to produce a stunning fingertip save.

With the teams still level, the match went to penalties. After a series of nerve-shredding moments, it was the eighth penalty that finally decided it. Rayen, showing remarkable composure, stepped up and buried his spot-kick with confidence. He was instantly surrounded by jubilant teammates as relief and excitement swept through the squad.

The final will take place at Rayners Lane FC this week, where the team will face Nower Hill. Let's hope they return with the trophy!





U13 Football Team Reach Borough Final

Our U13 boys became the second Park High football team to secure a place in this year's borough finals, following a convincing 2–0 victory over Pinner before the half term break. Both goals came in a strong first-half performance, giving the team control of the match early on.

It has been an outstanding season for the squad, and with only the final left to play, excitement is building. All finals will take place at Rayners Lane this week, offering a fantastic opportunity for our students to compete on a bigger stage. Last year, Park High brought home one borough football trophy, and this year the team is determined to go one better.

Reaching the final is a significant achievement in itself, with 12 teams competing in each age group. Being represented in two of the four borough finals highlights the depth of football talent at Park High and reflects the excellent competitive sporting opportunities available to our students.

Looking more broadly at sport across the school, we head into the Easter break with an impressive 13 borough trophies already secured this academic year. With our record standing at 17, the teams are well on track for another exceptional year of sporting success.

Park High Celebrates Coach Joel's Nomination

Park High is delighted to celebrate the recent award of coach Joel Fernandes, as London Coach of the Year, in recognition of his outstanding dedication and the positive impact he has had on player development. His commitment and expertise have also transformed table tennis at our school over the last three years. Alongside the work Joel does with our students he also serves as Head Coach for Stanmore Table Tennis Club.

Joel began coaching here during the 2023-24 academic year and he is now in his third year of delivering high quality weekly sessions that our students look forward to with great excitement. Under his guidance, the sport has grown far beyond what we could have imagined. Many of our students have joined Stanmore Table Tennis Club and several now compete in national ranking tournaments. In 2025 Park High reached number one for state school table tennis rankings in Harrow after winning two of the three borough championships and finishing as runners up in the third. Joel also encouraged our students to enter the West London Schools competition for the first time. This year they progressed from the West London region to the London and Essex finals which was a remarkable achievement.

Joel's award is thoroughly deserved and we are incredibly proud to celebrate this moment with him. We are grateful for everything he continues to bring to our school community and we look forward to many more exciting milestones ahead.

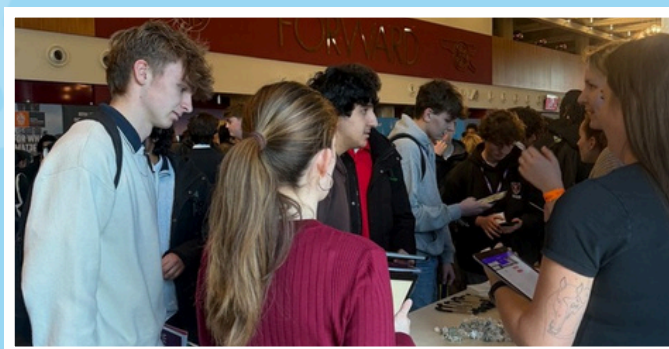
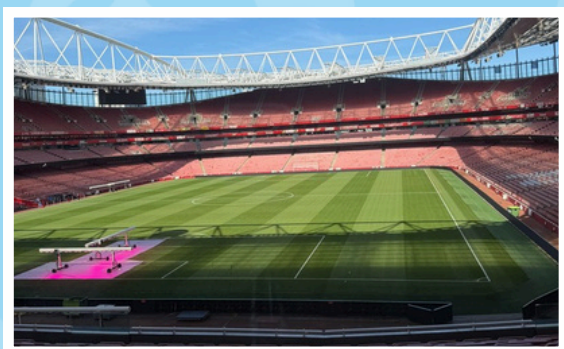
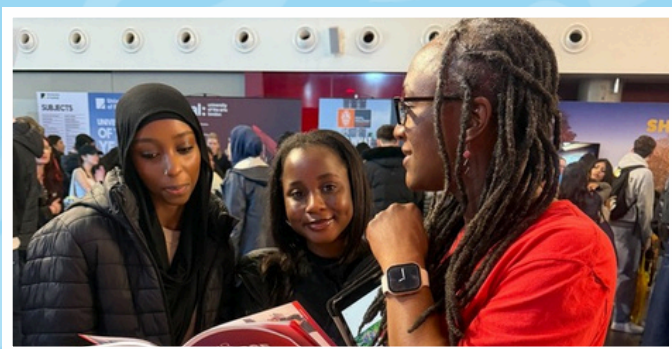
Careers Trip to the Emirates Stadium

Students Inspired at The World's Largest Dance Event

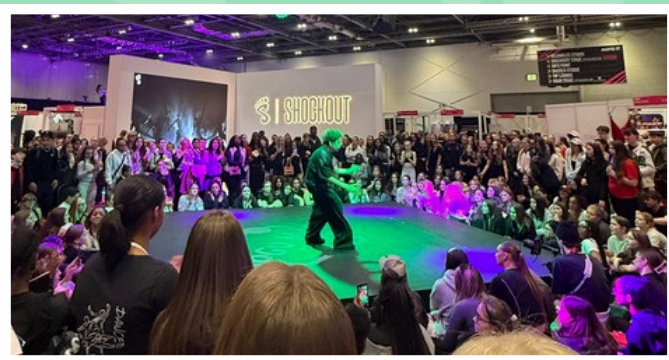

In addition, students spotted other well-known dance personalities, including Cacharel, a popular social media influencer celebrated for his dance content and appearance on a well known TV show.

We even bumped into our alumni Andreea and Kirsty from last year's dance class! The trip offered a meaningful insight into the vibrancy and scope of the dance industry. Our students returned inspired, informed and more motivated than ever about their potential futures.

Imperial College Neuroscience Society Conference



Students from our school had the exciting opportunity to attend the 'Meeting of the Minds' conference hosted by the Imperial College London Neuroscience Society on Saturday March 7th 2026 at the South Kensington campus. The event brought together leading neurosurgeons, neurologists and neuroscientists who delivered inspiring talks about the future of neuroscience and medicine.

The day provided students with valuable exposure to university level science and medical careers. Through talks delivered by experts such as Professor Oliver Bandman, Professor Sophie Scott, Professor Simon Shorvon, Professor Keyoumars Ashkan and Professor Dame Pam Shaw students gained a deeper understanding of the fascinating world of neuroscience.

The conference also featured a wide range of sessions including workshops on tumour removal simulation and the basics of EEG reading. Students were also able to observe a live human brain dissection led by Professor Steven Gentleman, which many described as one of the most memorable parts of the day.

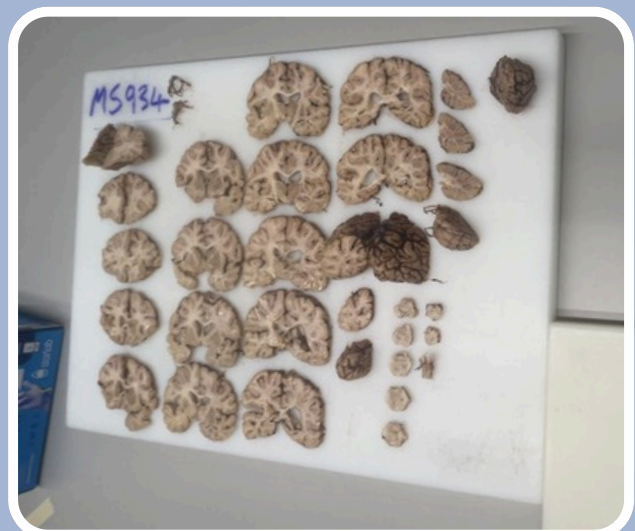
Several students shared their reflections on the experience:

We learnt about conditions such as ALS and MND, which helped me understand the seriousness of these diseases. We had the chance to see an actual human brain and it was one of the most fascinating scenes I've seen. Thank you, to Mrs Foster for giving us this exciting opportunity." - Sarina

The Meeting of the Minds conference offered an inspiring and educational experience. It encouraged our students to think about their future paths in medicine and science while giving them the chance to witness real clinical demonstrations.

A small act of kindness can spread faster than any viral post.

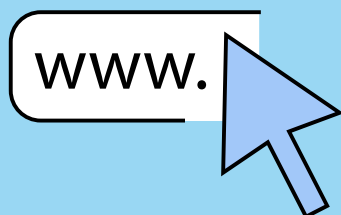
- Think before you comment.

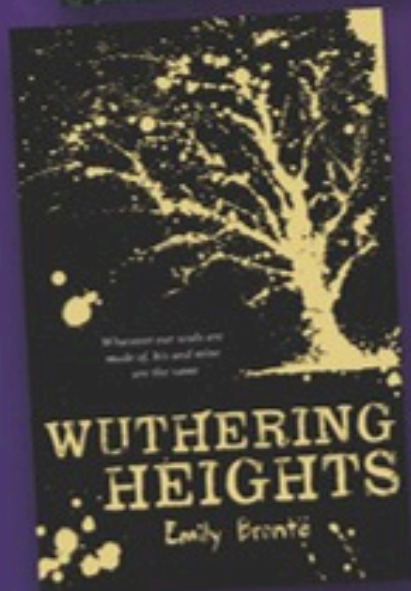
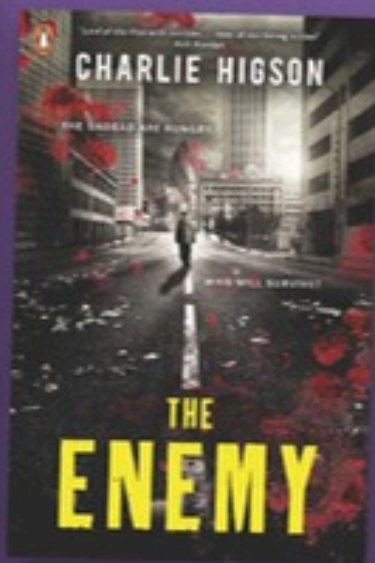

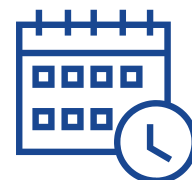
