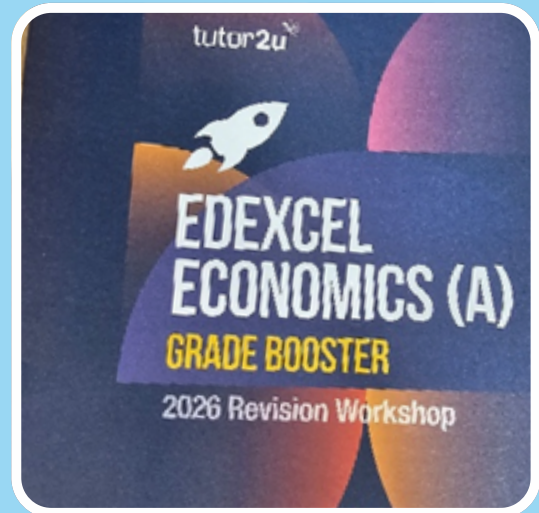
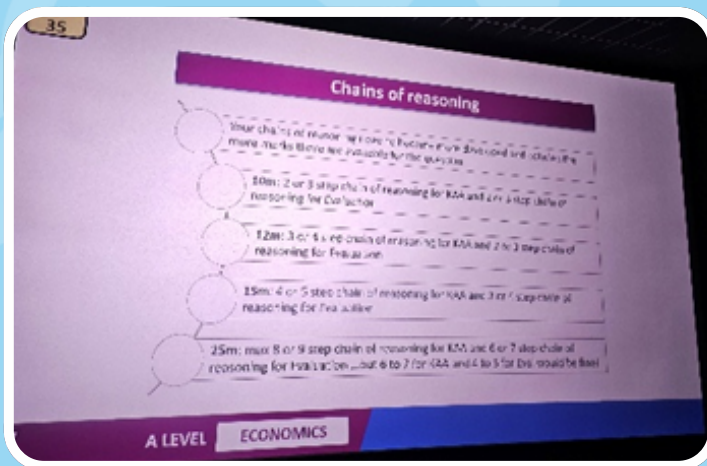
# A Level Economics Trip – Revision Workshop







Our Year 13 Economists attended a Grade Booster Workshop this week, which was held at Vue Cinema in Stratford. They received essential tips and advice on how to refine and sharpen key exam technique for their upcoming A Level Economics exams. (Some even went shopping straight after!) It was wonderful to see so many of you interacting and answering questions.

# British Airways Work Experience at Heathrow



I had an amazing opportunity to attend a British Airways Ground Operations Work Experience Insight Day at Heathrow Terminal 5. The day began with introductions and an overview of British Airways' history, which helped us understand the scale and importance of its operations.

Our first visit was to the Airport Operations Control Centre, where key decisions are made about flight planning and task allocation. It was impressive to see the strong sense of focus and professionalism as staff worked together to keep the airport running efficiently and smoothly.

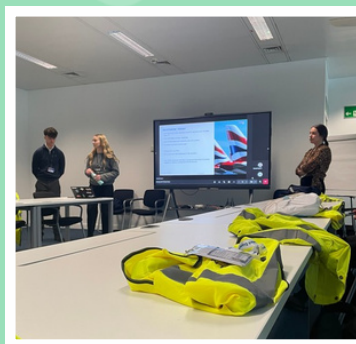
We then toured the baggage handling facilities, where I was amazed by how carefully coordinated the operation was. Seeing the complex systems in action highlighted the importance of communication and teamwork, as luggage was accurately sorted and sent to the correct aircraft. It was fascinating to see this behind-the-scenes area that passengers rarely notice, yet is vital to the airport's success.

After this, we went airside and spoke with several members of the ground team. A dispatcher explained their role in managing arriving and departing aircraft, emphasising how crucial time management is to ensure safe and efficient operations for both the airport and the airline.

To finish the day, we had the incredible opportunity to visit and go onboard several aircraft, including a Boeing 787 preparing for departure to Mexico. I was able to enter the cockpit and speak with the pilots about their careers at British Airways, and I also watched a pushback carried out by a robotic system.

Overall, the experience was inspiring and gave me valuable insight into the wide range of careers involved in aviation and airport operations.
