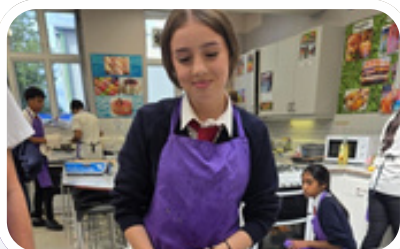

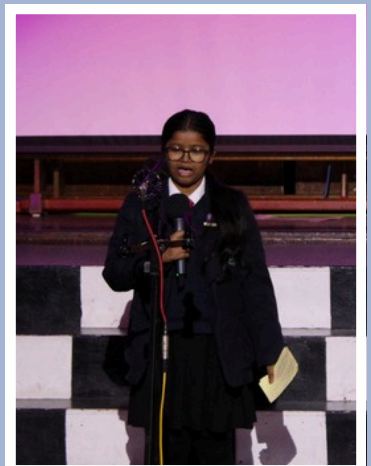

# Year 12 Art Students Explore the Wallace Collection

The Wallace Collection, a national museum in London, houses an extensive and remarkable art collection. Formerly the private collection of Sir Richard Wallace, it was generously gifted to the British nation by Lady Wallace in 1897, allowing the public to enjoy its rich cultural heritage.

On Monday 11th May, Year 12 Art students visited the museum to take part in a drawing workshop. Throughout the day, students engaged in a variety of practical activities within the galleries, developing their observational skills and exploring different drawing techniques. They had the opportunity to practise drawing the human form, building both confidence and technical ability in a stimulating environment.

The workshop provided a highly educational experience, encouraging experimentation while supporting students to refine and expand their artistic approaches.

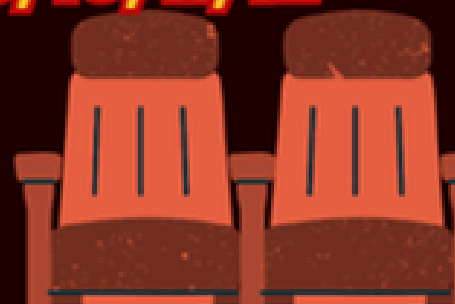
