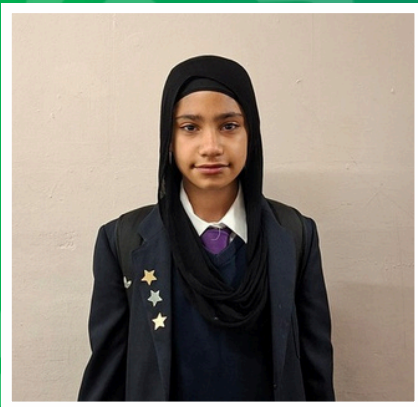

Well done Year 8 on getting through most of your End of Year assessments last week.

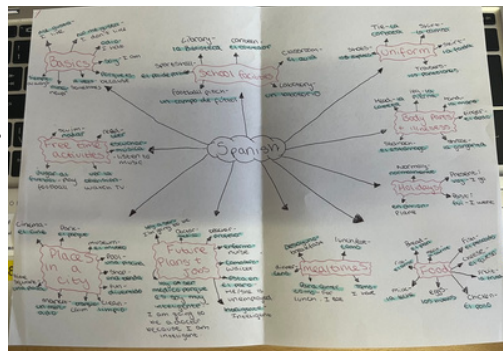

Students had an inspiring day at Imperial College London, working alongside JP Morgan Chase and SmartSTEMs. The experience helped to open doors to future careers in technology and beyond, while strengthening links with both industry professionals and our partner primary schools.

A special congratulations goes to Alesia Ambrusi, who achieved an outstanding accomplishment. Alesia came 1st out of 150 students in a competition to design an app, an incredible achievement! Her winning idea will now be developed into a real, working app by JP Morgan Chase engineers, who will be visiting the school soon to share with staff and students this exciting new app so we can try it out.

Alesia's app is designed to help users create meals using ingredients already available at home. This encourages creativity in cooking, supports all skill levels, and importantly helps to reduce food waste, a brilliant idea with real-world impact.

"On Tuesday we visited Imperial College in South Kensington. It was mainly focused on STEM. Many workshops were held by JP Morgan Chase and it was very interactive. We learnt about how apps are made and how messages and secret codes are encrypted. Using this, we were taught how to decrypt codes. 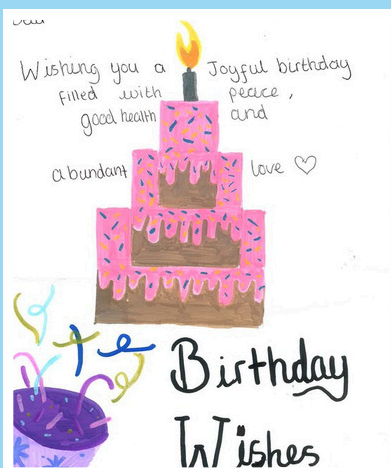
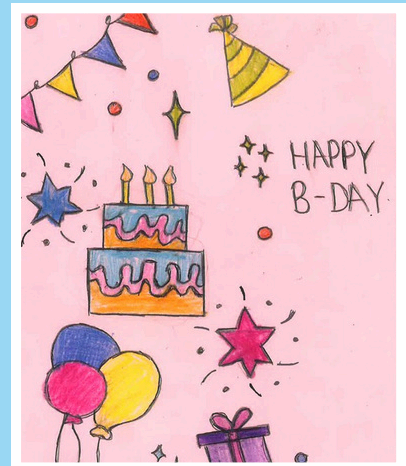

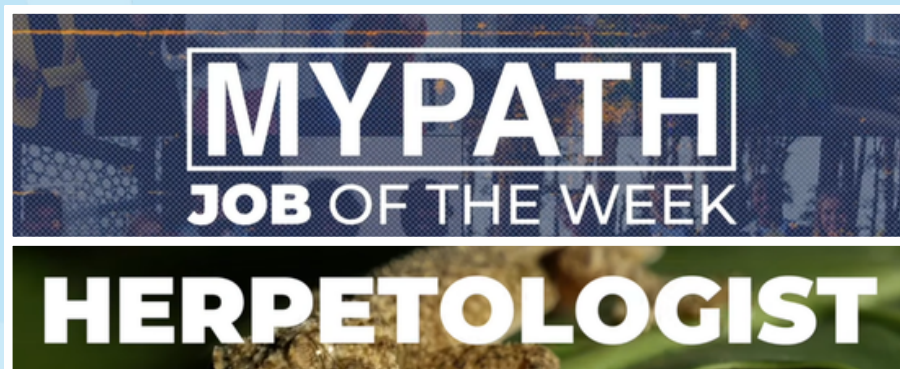
Spreading Birthday Joy in Our Community

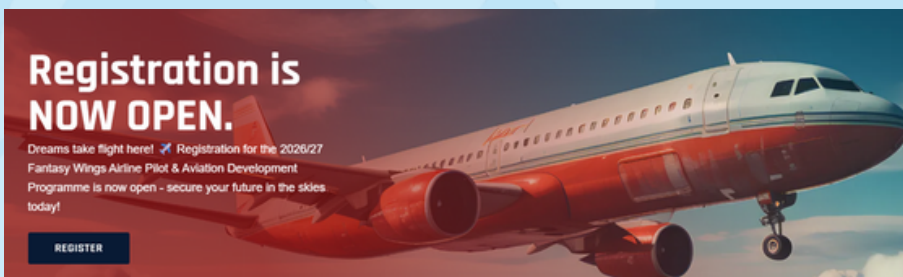

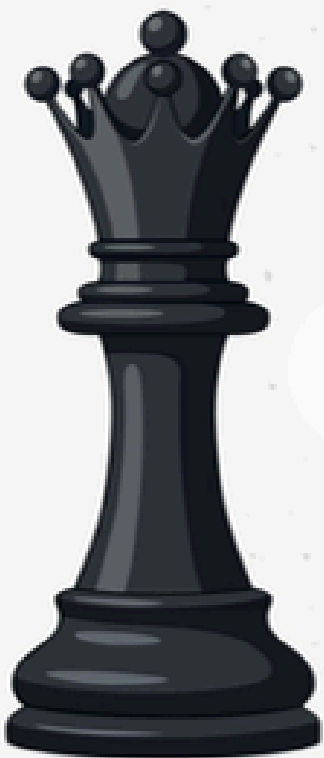

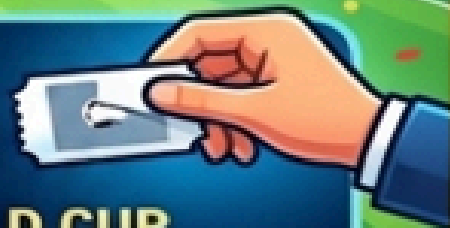
