REGENT'S PARK TAKES THE LEAD

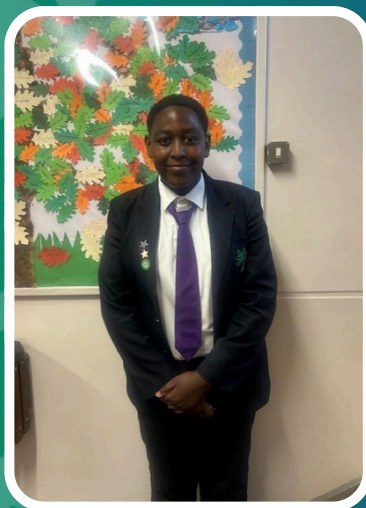
With just two weeks left, Regent's Park have overtaken Hyde Park in the House Competition!

We will announce the winners in next week's Student Bulletin, after Year 9 have had their turn. For now, enjoy these photos from across the week.

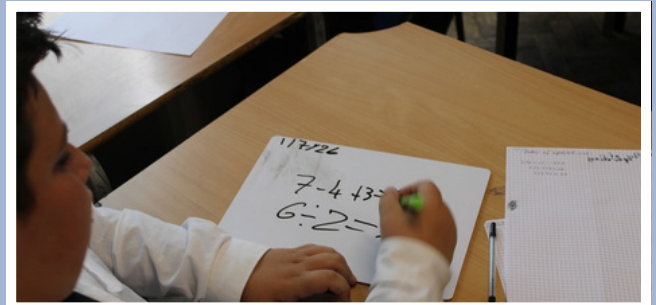


Year 6 Transition Day

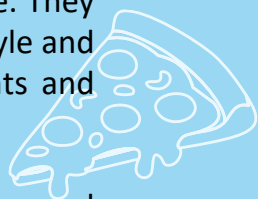
Pizza Making Workshop With Caterlink

During the session, students discovered how pizza is made from scratch, learning about the ingredients used in dough, including the important roles of yeast and sugar, as well as how gluten-free dough is prepared. Students developed their practical skills by using their hands to knead and shape dough into the perfect pizza bases.

The workshop also explored the fascinating history of pizza, how to create a delicious tomato sauce, and the wide variety of toppings enjoyed around the world. Students learned useful tips on how to bake pizzas successfully at home to achieve the best results.

Beyond the cooking skills, the session encouraged students to think about their own eating habits and the foods they enjoy at home. They discussed how balanced meals can contribute to a healthy lifestyle and learned about the importance of including a range of nutrients and vitamins in their diet.

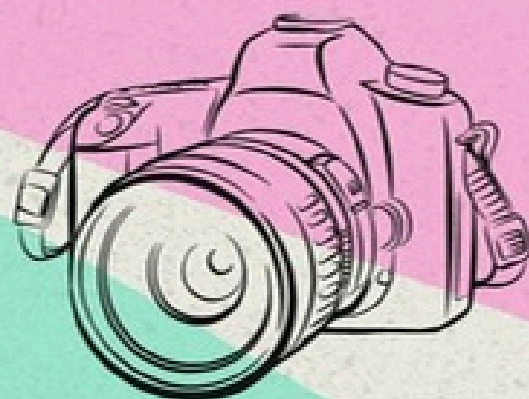

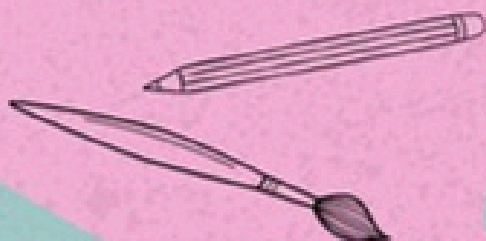

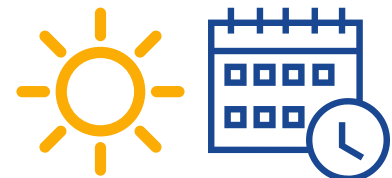
