Because there is so much information, it needs to be organised, so that the information can be found quickly and easily.

This is where the Dewey Decimal Classification system comes in



What is the Dewey Decimal System

* The Dewey Decimal System is used to classify books by grouping them into ten subject categories and giving each subject a number

* It was developed by an American Librarian, Melvil Dewey in

1876.

000	GENERAL (including computing)
100	PHILOSOPHY AND PSYCHOLOGY
200	RELIGION
300	SOCIAL SCIENCES
400	LANGUAGE
500	NATURAL SCIENCE
600	APPLIED SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY
700	THE ARTS AND RECREATION
800	LITERATURE
900	GEOGRAPHY AND HISTORY

What does a Dewey Decimal Number look like

A Dewey number <u>always</u> has three numbers to the left of the decimal point. For example

796 is sport

To the right of the decimal, there is no limit on number. The more numbers to the right of the decimal the more specific the subject is -

796.358077 is coaching youth cricket

The Dewey Decimal System in Detail



The Dewey Decimal System has a number for all books. Just because it is in the Dewey Decimal System doesn't mean it is NON-Fiction

Some examples of books in the Dewey Decimal System that are fiction are:

Poetry at 821.08

Plays at 822

Folk and Fairy Tales are 398 and 398.2

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN FICTION AND NON-FICTION



FICTION – Books/Stories that are made up by the author are FICTION.
Although these books do have a Dewey Decimal number, you will find them shelved together in alphabetical order by the author's last name.



 NON-FICTION books are about real events, people and places and are shelved by their subjects category using the Dewey Decimal system.
